## What is the Foreclosure Diversion Program? How Does It Work?

- **STEP 1:** The homeowner receives notice from the court with the scheduled date and time of the Conciliation Conference. This should be delivered with the Complaint in Mortgage Foreclosure.
- STEP 2: The homeowner calls the Hotline at 215-334-HOME (215-334-4663)
- **STEP 3:** The Hotline schedules the homeowner to meet with a housing counselor.
- **STEP 4:** The homeowner takes the significant financial documents to the meeting with the housing counselor. A list of what to take to this meeting will be sent by the hotline to the homeowner.
- **STEP 5:** The housing counselor reviews the homeowner's situation and prepares a proposal to resolve the loan default in a way that is affordable and realistic for the homeowner.
- **STEP 6:** The housing counselor contacts the lender to negotiate a work-out.
- STEP 7: The homeowner attends the Conciliation Conference in Courtroom 676 in City Hall. Attorneys representing the lender will be present.
- **STEP 8:** The steps 4 through 7 may be repeated several times. When a suitable work-out arrangement is agreed to by all parties, the foreclosure will be halted and the homeowner's property will not be sold at Sheriff's Sale. If a suitable work-out is not reached, the Court will authorize the foreclosure to move on to judgment and possibly to Sheriff's Sale.

Conciliation conference dates are subject to change. If your date is changed you will receive an official notice from the Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas.
